

Michele Meadors is preparing to compete in the Ms. Wheelchair American pageant in Long Beach, California scheduled for August 2014. She was crowned Ms. Wheelchair Iowa 2014 this spring. Michele was involved in an auto accident that resulted in a spinal cord injury in 2011. She is paralyzed from the neck down. Michelle's goal as Ms. Wheelchair Iowa 2014 is to advocate and educate on disability issues. Currently she participates in groups such as the Iowa Final Authority to work on housing and transportation issues for Iowans with disabilities.

Michele is a member of the Iowa Olmstead Consumer Task Force (OCTF) and the treasurer of the Iowa Statewide Independent Living Council (SILC). Michele believes that society must focus on the *abilities* of people with disabilities and forms her platform on accenting the remarkable characteristics that all people bring to life.

Michele, age 46, grew up in Corydon, Iowa. After completing rehabilitation in Omaha, she decided to move back to Des Moines, but struggled to find an accessible home. It required 6 months time and searching 16 apartment buildings before she found a place suited for her needs.

Michele loves to garden.

Michele is raising funds to participate in the Ms. Wheelchair America pageant in Long Beach, Calif., in August. A Helping Hand in Gaining Your Independence: Access to Independence

Formerly known as The Evert Conner Center For Independent Living, Access 2 Independence has been working to empower people with disabilities in the Eastern Iowa Corridor since 1979. This non-profit Center For Independent Living serves Benton, Linn, Jones, Iowa, Johnson, Cedar, Washington, & Henry counties.

In their aim to respectfully empower people with disabilities, Access 2 Independence functions through 4 Core Services:

Advocacy Peer Counseling & Support Groups Independent Living Skills Information & Community Referrals

In 2013, Access 2 Independence spearheaded the 23rd annual Johnson County celebration of the Americans with Disabilities Act, providing carnival styled games & a resource fair featuring local community organizations, groups, & service providers. They also established & now run the following support groups:

The Expressive Arts Group - exploring self-expression through various art mediums

Invisible Disabilities Support Group Of Greater Iowa City - support for those with "hidden" disabilities

The Q Group - cross-disability peer support for Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, & Asexual individuals

Slip-on Typing/Keyboard Aid



This typing aid is brown, with a tan Velcro strap. The hand opening is about 4 inches wide and the length of the device is about 6 ½ inches. It has a rubber tip that is a darker brown than the device.

The Slip-on Typing/Keyboard Aid is designed for use by people with limited grasp who cannot access a keyboard with their fingers. The device features a loop that slips over the hand and tightens with a Velcro strap. The pointer end has a rounded rubber tip for striking the keys. Models are available for right- or left-hand use. One size fits all.

NaturalPoint's SmartNav Mouse

NaturalPoint's SmartNav is a hands-free mouse alternative that allows complete control of a computer by the user with head movement. The device can be placed anywhere as long as it can see the reflective accessory. Less than an inch of head movement is more than enough to move the cursor across the entire screen.



This device is approximately 2 ½ inches tall and 3 inches wide, and it looks like a small TV. It has an easily adjustable clip so you can clip it to your computer. This device has a USB cord to plug in.
